



Emma E. Porio, Ph.D., Professor of Sociology, Department of Sociology and Anthropology (DSA) at the Ateneo de Manila University (Philippines) and Science Research Fellow of the Manila Obseratory. A very engaged public sociologist, she led the following organizations: President, Philippine Sociological Society (1999-2001), Editor, Philippine Sociological Review (2002-2004), President/Chair, Governing Council of the Philippine Social Science Council (2006-2008) and the Technical Panel for Sociology and Anthropology in the Commission for Higher Education (1997-2007) in the Philippines. She serves on the board of the Global Development Network (India/Washington DC; 2015-2018) and the International Sociological Association (Madrid, Spain; 2006-2014). She has served as consultant

to development assistance agencies like the World Bank, International Development and Research centre (IDRC), Japan Bank for International Cooperation (JBIC), UNICEF, ILO and the Asian Development Bank.

Prof. Porio has lectured, researched and written extensively on poverty, governance, children, gender, urban and local development but has focused on climate change and flood disasters in the last 6 years. Her works on climate adaptation was recently awarded "Outstanding Scholarly Work with Most Social Impact" by the Ateneo de Manila University.

Currently, she is a Fulbright Research Fellow (affiliated with Hofstra University and the Huairou Commission) doing comparative research on climate resilience initiatives of marginal populations in Metro Manila and New York City.
